

Thank you for caring about the cat that has been visiting you.

A paper collar is a great way to determine if a cat in your neighbourhood is a stray, or if she has a home.

There are no laws against cats roaming outdoors, and they are good at finding their way home. If you're not sure if she's lost or homeless, if you can safely handle her and she is friendly, place a paper collar on her with your phone number and let her back out in the neighbourhood.

If no one contacts you, you cannot find her owner and she keeps coming back, call the OHS to schedule an appointment to bring her to the shelter. Contact 311 if her situation changes, she is in danger or needs help immediately.
